The Minor Prophets ministered for over three centuries in the most tumultuous times in Israel’s history, yet their message remains relevant for the chaotic times in which we live. The Old Testament prophets courageously confronted the sinfulness and idolatry of God’s people and called for repentance. Pastoral Theology

Theological Foundations for Who a Pastor Is and What He Does

Daniel L. Akin and R. Scott Pace

While many pastoral ministry books focus on the practical duties of the pastor, few works actually consider how theological truth defines the pastor's role and responsibilities. These pragmatic ministry tools, though instructionally beneficial, essentially divorce biblical doctrine from ministerial practice. As a result, pastors' lives and ministries often lack the theological roots that provide the stability and nourishment necessary to sustain them.

Pastoral Theology constructs a theological framework for pastoral ministry that is biblically derived, historically informed, doctrinally sound, missionally engaged, and contextually relevant. Using traditional theological categories the authors explore the correlation between evangelical doctrine and pastoral practice. Through careful theological integration they

formulate a ministry philosophy that defines the pastoral office and determines its corresponding responsibilities in light of theological truth.

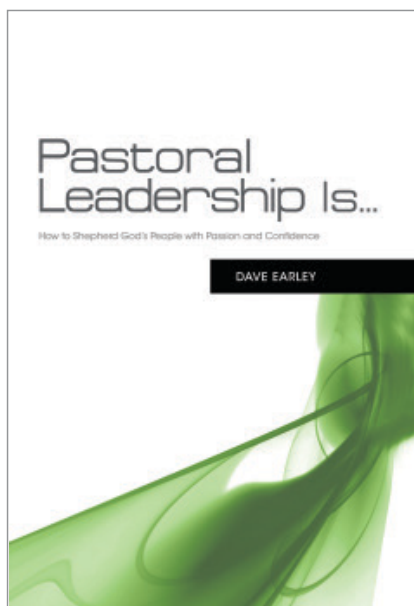
The authors provide a theological understanding of the pastorate that will equip aspiring pastors to discern and pursue their calling, challenge younger pastors to build on ministerial truth instead of ministerial trends, and inspire seasoned pastors to be reinvigorated in their passion for Christ and his church.

Not only that, but it was helpful since mywsb.com is accessible from any computer with an internet connection or when Wi-Fi was available for electronic devices. It also adds convenience since many resources can be held in one place and the cumbersome activity of carrying around those resources at one time is avoided."
