AN INTERVIEW WITH THE AUTHOR // -

Why is Christian Theology ideal for classroom use?


This book is a mid-level systematic theology that is both faithful to Holy Scripture and straightforward, comprehensive and concise, meaty and accessible, orthodox and charitable, thoughtful and practical. It is exegetical, based on years of careful study of God's Word, thus grounding it firmly in the Bible's story line. *Christian Theology* is clearly outlined and clearly written, out of the conviction that God intends biblical teaching to be understood, believed, and lived. Ultimately, my aim in writing this texbook was to help both individuals and churches grow in understanding of, love for, and obedience to God and his Word.

If What makes *Christian Theology* stand out among other systematic theology textbooks?

When I sat down to write this book, my desire was to form a systematic theology that sang like a hymnbook, not one that read like a phone book. For this reason, I made the headings and explanations personal, helping readers know that God loves them and that they have both identity and purpose in Christ. And although theology books sometimes stress disagreements among Christians, I aimed to highlight what we know and agree on, hopefully encouraging evangelical unity. I included the exegesis of key passages to illustrate the source of core doctrines, thus promoting both understanding and hermeneutical skills. There is also a focus on application and the Christian life, in an effort to move the content from knowledge to action. *Christian Theology* is based squarely in Scripture, but it also takes into account the views of others, both historic and contemporary. For this reason, it includes voices from church history and voices from the global church today.

What inspired you to write this book?

^{ff} I have taught Christian theology in college and seminary classrooms and pastored for over twenty years. *Christian Theology* grew out of that experience in a number of ways. First and foremost, I was moved by my students' eager reception of the truths of God's Word. I wanted to create something that would speak to the upcoming generation and the church at large. I could see a need for a midsize and concise systematic theology textbook that didn't sacrifice the wide treatment of solid content, and was also warm, personal, and even pastoral. I have benefited greatly from the theological works of others who came before me, and my hope is to be able to provide students with an accessible, winsome systematic theology that meets the needs in the classroom and the church.



What if talking about your faith felt as natural as discussing your family, your work, or your hobbies?

Evangelism doesn't have to be uncomfortable. You're under no pressure to prove anything. It really just amounts to having a conversation, and almost any context provides the opportunity for evangelism. You can spot these opportunities when you listen, because people talk about what's important to them. So think of evangelism as building a relationship with someone and intentionally planning to share Jesus as a part of everyday living.

Sharing Jesus without Freaking Out, Second Edition is not a comprehensive theology of evangelism or the methods by which that theological message is communicated. The goal of the book is simply to show what evangelism looks like when it's part of ordinary, everyday conversations. Sharing Jesus with others isn't a mystery, and it can be as natural as working a job, practicing a favorite hobby, or engaging in any other kind of daily activity. The authors show how anyone can make sharing the gospel a commonplace part of their lifestyle. Without all the freaking out.


