Thank you for considering our B&H Academic 2024–2025 catalog. We have many noteworthy releases to spotlight this year, including volumes in two significant new series.

Or new to us, at least. The first series you're already familiar with, *New Studies in Biblical Theology* (NSBT), edited by D. A. Carson and Benjamin Gladd. After three decades of InterVarsity Press partnering with Apollos to publish NSBT, B&H Academic has become NSBT's North American publisher. We're grateful for the wonderful work IVP did with the series for so many years and humbled by the responsibility of inheriting its stewardship. You can see forthcoming releases in the series on pg. 6.

The other new series is *Pillars in Christian Dogmatics* (pg. 7), an ambitious exercise in creative theological retrieval edited by Matthew Barrett and Craig Carter. With more than a dozen volumes already contracted, the series will feature top scholars from various denominational backgrounds, all drawing on the Great Tradition to foster contemplation of the beauty of the Triune God.

A few other titles I'll mention briefly:

- *Complementarity* by Gregg Allison (pg. 10) presents a fresh, foundational framework for understanding men and women in Christ that emphasizes equal dignity, significant difference, and flourishing interdependence.
- Gregory Lanier's *Apocryphal Prophets and Athenian Poets* (pg. 25) offers a comprehensive examination of the Jewish, Greco-Roman, and early Christian writings that influenced the New Testament authors.
- An eminent biblical theologian displays the fruit of a lifetime of study in Graeme Goldsworthy's *In These Last Days* (pg. 30), an invitation to better understand the dynamics of biblical revelation.
- The third volume of Gary Habermas's *On the Resurrection: Scholarly Perspectives* (pg. 33) buttresses the first two volumes, *Evidences* and *Refutations*, by providing scholars and students with a thoroughly cataloged, 992-page bibliography for further research and reflection.
- Finally, in *To Change All Worlds: Critical Theory from Marx to Marcuse* (pg. 43), Carl Trueman turns his attention from sexual identity, as explored in *The Rise and Fall of the Modern Self*, to critical theory more broadly, expertly tracing its development and consequences.

Called to Freedom
