Egypt My People...and Israel My Inheritance

The non-Israelite nations in the Latter Prophets
 DANIEL C. TIMMER

Few parts of the OT are more challenging to read than the prophets. Not only are so-called messianic passages relatively rare, but apart from Jonah, these books seem to present a message that is particularly negative, if not xenophobic, when it comes to the 'nations.'


Daniel Timmer contends that this impression is not only mistaken, but diametrically opposed to the books' message. Following the direction established by God's foundational promise to Abram in Genesis 12, Timmer examines the presentation of the nations in the Latter Prophets in their original contexts, through the NT and into the church's contemporary mission. He explains how the prophets' negative presentations of the nations fit into God's purpose to redeem people from every tribe and nation, and explores the radical significance of the prophets' frequent predictions that non-Israelites will become integral members of God's chosen people.

The volume also deals with practical issues, including the place of ethnicity and nationality in Christian identity and the church's fraught relationships with secular and political power structures.

DANIEL TIMMER (PhD, Trinity International University) is professor of biblical studies and director of PhD program at Puritan Reformed Theological Seminary.

Q&A With Benjamin L. Gladd, Series Editor

What excites you about the new chapter for this well-developed series?

The first NSBT volume appeared in 1995 with David Peterson's *Possessed by God*. Here we are thirty years later with the appearance of volume 63 with Daniel Timmer's *"Egypt My People...and Israel My Inheritance."* I'm excited to explore more themes contained in Scripture and, especially, publish volumes on inner-biblical connections.

Does each volume follow the same structure?

Some volumes explore themes contained within a particular book (Leviticus, Isaiah, Mark, etc.), others relate biblical theology to other disciplines, and finally, most trace specific themes throughout Scripture. In the end, though, all the volumes keep an eye on wider biblical-theological connections and, ultimately, on Christ and his work.

How does each volume lead the reader into a deeper understanding of biblical theology?

Scripture largely concerns God's plan, through Christ, to redeem his people from sin and plant them in the new heavens and earth where God dwells. We've designed these volumes to help people understand that biblical-theological story from a wide variety of angles.

How can this series serve the pastor-theologian?

The NSBT is for lay people, students, pastors, and teachers who can't get enough of the Bible. For pastor-theologians, this series will invigorate the mind and the heart.

How do you plan to continue Dr. Carson's legacy through this series?

Dr. Carson's vision for the series has always been to produce books that evidence the best of confessional evangelicalism, engage relevant literature, and instruct and edify the church. By the grace of God, sixty-three volumes have fulfilled that vision. I'd like to double that number, as the Bible is so rich, so interconnected, and much work remains.


